• **Turnitin/Grademark** - Instructors using the Turnitin plagiarism detection tool should be aware that courses expire within Turnitin approximately six months after they are created in D2L. Documents in Turnitin will be inaccessible as well as any custom Quickmark libraries after the course expires. Instructors may request access to expired

D2L 10... Upgrade Complete!

On December 15, Clarion University and all of the PASSHEschools successfully completed an **upgrade from Desire2Learn version 9.4 to version 10**. Initial testing was completed with success and D2L was up and running for winter intersession courses. Prior to the upgrade, links to introductory videos were emailed to faculty and students to minimize the impact of the revised Learning Environment layout. In addition, a web page was constructed highlighting the changes and updated features.

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Post Quiz Feedback - If you want students to have access to past quizzes, you can now enable student view details by customizing the default submission view. Just select the quiz you wish to edit, go to the "submission view" tab, and select the view options desired. As always, please call the LTC with any questions or for assistance.

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FYI - D2L Course Access - Instructors, please be aware that D2L will not register course access if a user clicks into your course using the mobile app on a mobile device (ipad, phone, etc.). The system will log the users system access, just not course access. This only occurs with the mobile device's native mobile app. If the user switches to a device's "desktop view" when available, then both course and system access will be logged.
