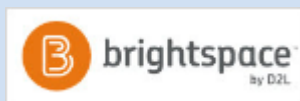

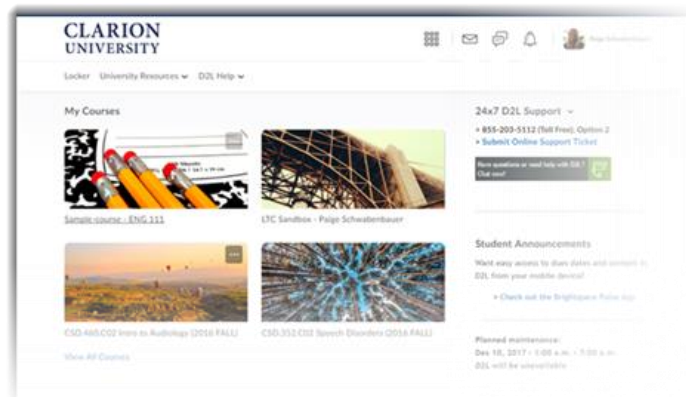
REGULAR and SUBSTANTIVE Interaction in Online Courses: What can we do?

Teaching Students How to Learn Retreat

Approximately 21 colleagues attended or presented at a faculty retreat hosted jointly by Partners in Teaching, Learning and Assessment, The Center for First-Year Experience (FYE), and the Learning Technology Center this past summer. The August 18 excursion was held at Dr. Rhonda Clark's historic, oil-era Titusville home and all faculty were invited to attend. The retreat centered around Sandra Yancy McGuire's book, *Teach Students How to Learn*, and featured six mini-sessions aimed at helping to focus students' learning and study skills. Topics included metacognition, the study cycle, using double-entry journals, reading strategies, faculty and student roles in promoting optimal learning, and technology resources available to support the concepts presented in the book.

Summer Upgrades



Several upgrades took place over the summer related to the D2L Learning Environment:

- **MAY 2017 - Blackboard Collaborate Classic upgraded to Collaborate with the Ultra Experience:**

In D2L, "Online Rooms" has been made unavailable to students, and replaced with Collaborate Ultra on the Communication nav bar. Faculty, however, can still access the Online Rooms tool and their archives to add links to previous recordings in their current courses. Collaborate Ultra is user friendly and has many uses: Virtual office hours, lecture capture (mp4), synchronous instruction, screen sharing, meetings, etc.

Faculty with archives made in the Classic version of Collaborate will be contacted in November to determine if any of their archives will need retained for future use.

- **JULY 2017 - Turnitin:**

This 3rd party plagiarism detection tool has been upgraded to Turnitin/Feedback Studio. The upgrade brings a few changes

to the way Turnitin is enabled in D2L as well as the way dates are interpreted. [Please review the details pertaining to copying folders, setting dates and other Turnitin options.](#)

The new Feedback Studio interface of Turnitin has been a welcome change for faculty and students offering easy access to online grading and feedback.
