

D2L Update Notes

~ FYI - Regarding January's "Improvements to Assignments List View" - Last month, we reported about the new "opt-in" Assignments experience which allows users the option to "Turn On" the new experience, or "Leave it Off" to continue with the old/current list view.

However, the new Assignments list view does not include a "new submissions" column, which appears in the current view. Now, when the updates widget on your course home page reflects there are new Assignment submissions, it may be more difficult to identify which folders have "new submissions". D2L has been made aware of this issue.

You can easily "Turn Off" the new assignment experience, by clicking the tab in the Assignments list view. (see image below). However, please be aware that the "Opt-in" selection will be retired in May 2019, and all users will be using the NEW Assignments List View.



~February Update - Improvements to Rubrics - Instructors - The February update introduced a more streamlined approach to authoring rubric levels and criteria via the new **opt-in** rubric creation experience during the Spring 2019 term. Beginning Summer 2019, instructors will no longer have the option: "opt-in" will be retired and the new experience will become the default. *For a list of specific enhancements to the new rubrics creation process*, please see the February update document.

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
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Spring Workshop Series
