Using Transparent Assignment Design to Increase Student Success

Help increase clarity and foster a deeper appreciation for course assignments using the transparent assignment design! The more traditional assignment approach typically provides the task and possibly a rubric for both small and high-stakes assignments. Transparent assignment design is a teaching method that helps students understand *how* and *why* they are learning in specific ways. This systematic approach to assignment design consists of three key components: *purpose*, *task*, and *criteria for success*. This small teaching intervention has a positive learning impact of showing students what you expect of them and why you are asking them to do specific tasks.



ePortfolio Available in D2L

Over the past two semesters, D2L's ePortfolio product has been piloted with two graduate programs: Doctor of Nursing Practice, and M.Ed. - Concentration in Curriculum, Instruction, and Teacher Leadership endorsement.

D2L/ePortfolio gives students and instructors the ability to create collections and presentations that showcase their experience, skills and



accomplishments for potential employers, grad school applications, and internship opportunities by sharing samples of their work in a digital format. Graduating students will have the option to transfer their items from ePortfolio into the "MyDesire2Learn" ePortfolio platform hosted by D2L. MyD2L gives students ePortfolio for life, with up to 2GB of space for free.

To give the pilot participants the opportunity to export their ePortfolio contents to MyD2L, ePortfolio will be enabled system-wide on **April 15** which will subsequently allow any student the ability to create and edit their ePortfolios. Users will access ePortfolio from the "University Resources" menu in the D2L navigation bar.

Students will be notified using s_announce as well as the Student Announcement area within D2L. In addition, getting started instructions for students can be found in our documentation. 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The Final Stretch

The end of the term is rapidly approaching. With exams and final projects looming, faculty and students alike may be tired and anxious. Perhaps a small change in routine is just what's in order to create a surge of energy and excitement for the final stretch of the term. Some food for thought:

- **Surveys**: Take a few minutes to learn from your students. Consider using a survey with targeted questions that students can answer anonymously. This is a great way to get honest feedback on class policies, projects, or anything to guide your instructional or classroom (or online) practice.
- Exams: Everyone can get a little stressed when exams roll around. Help your students be more productive by building in short periods of quiet or movement to help alleviate anxiety. Consider playing calm music while students work independently on short practice questions. Alternatively, get them up and moving around the room for review "stations" taught by their peers. Host online review sessions in Zoom or provide wiki pages for peer support for your online students.
- **Instructional**: Consider trying a new (bite-sized) activity or experience related to something you've taught but didn't have time for consider a guest from the community, virtual field trip, simulation or role play activity to change things up and inject freshness into a course.

While faculty and students alike are focused on getting to the end of the term, now is also a good time to test drive small changes in teaching that may fuel new and exciting approaches for the next term.
