

## Creating Narrated PowerPoint Presentations

These are general instructions. Please follow the directions provided by your instructor for file format and submission. Please note that Microsoft PowerPoint versions **prior** to 2007 (Windows) and 2011 (Mac) will not embed the audio with the file. Therefore, when playback is attempted on another computer (i.e, your instructor's), it may not contain your narration.

### You will need:

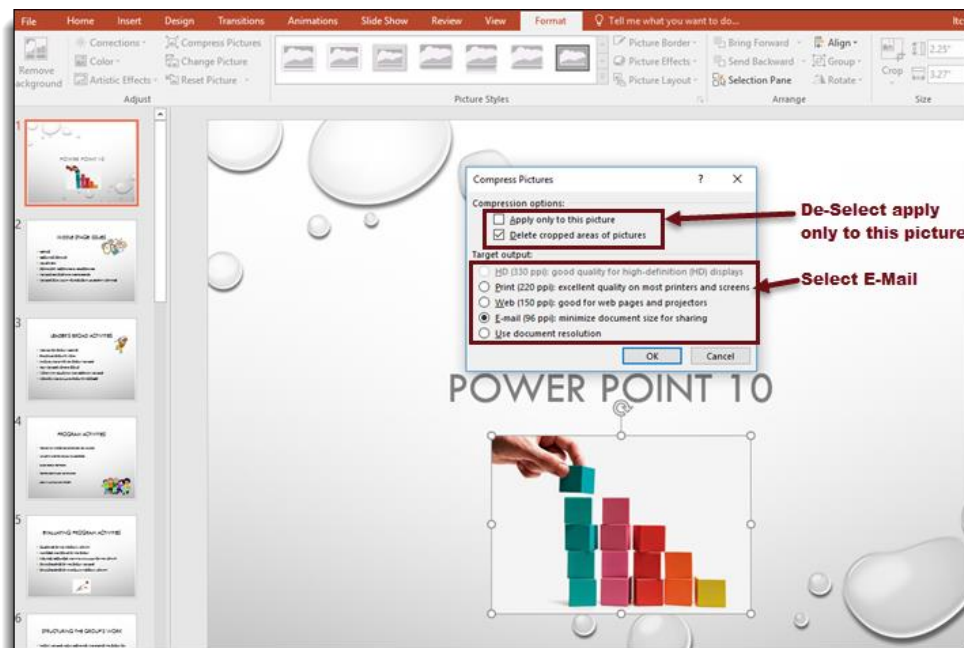
1. A windows computer with PowerPoint 2007 or later or Mac with PowerPoint 2011 or later
2. An inexpensive USB headset with microphone
3. The PowerPoint file you wish to narrate

*NOTE: It is recommended that you compress your image files before saving the final version. Select one image in the presentation and then follow the screenshot below:*

### Windows / Compress the images in your PowerPoint:

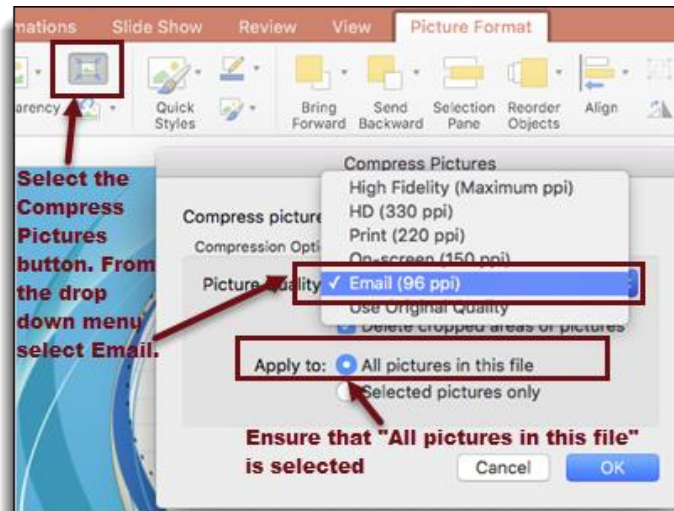
*Adding audio to your PowerPoint will create a large file size which can cause upload problems. It is important to compress any additional media in the presentation, beginning with your images.*

- 1) Open the presentation you wish to narrate
- 2) Select an image > Picture tools > Format tab > Compress Pictures in the "Adjust" group
- 3) Save the presentation in the .ppt format.



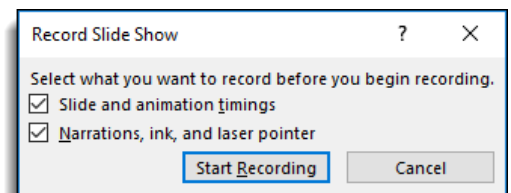
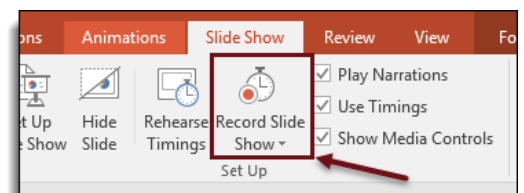
## Mac / Compress the images in your PowerPoint:

- 1) Open the presentation you wish to narrate
- 2) Select an image > Picture tools > Format tab
- 3) Select the Compress Picture button > and from the drop-down menu
- 4) Apply to "All pictures in this file"



## Windows / Record Narration and edit or re-record separate slides

- 1) Open the presentation you wish to narrate
  - Select the **Slide Show** tab
  - Select "Record Slide show"
  - From the drop down menu:
    - Record from "Beginning"
    - Or, from "Current Slide" (if editing one slide)
  - Select "Start recording"
  - Your PowerPoint will open in Slide Show view and you will see the recording controls in the upper left portion of the screen.
  - Pause/Resume as needed



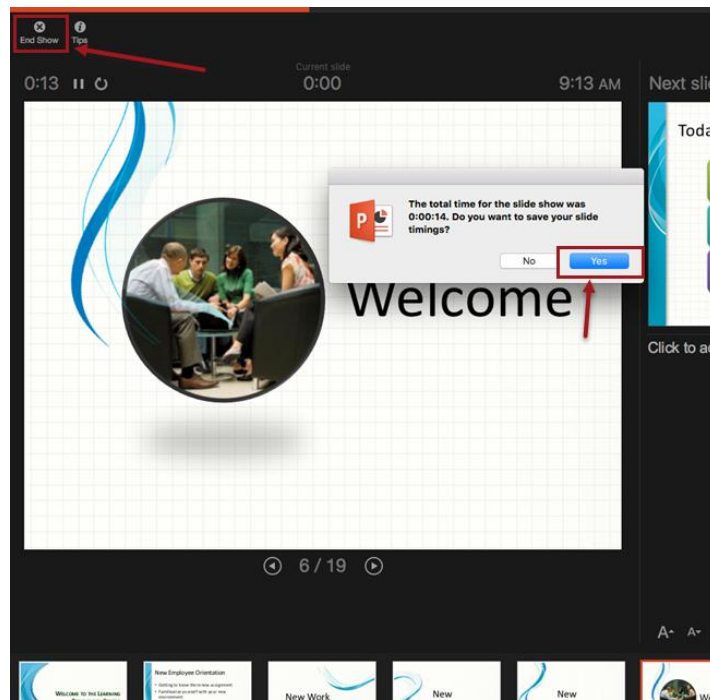
- 2) "Esc" when finished; after a few moments, your PowerPoint will display in "**Slide Sorter View**"
  - In "Slide Sorter", you can view timings and narration on each slide
  - Select a single slide to review the narration and/or edit the narration
    - "Start recording from current slide" to record over the previous narration
- 3) **SAVE** your presentation (.pptx)

## MAC / Record Narration and edit or re-record separate slides

*NOTE: Follow the steps above to narrate your PowerPoint on a MAC.*

*Before you before you begin recording:*

- Make sure your microphone is set up correctly. On the Mac, go to System Preferences > Sound.
- 1) After Clicking Start Recording, a new page will automatically appear, and your recording will begin.
  - 2) When you are finished recording, select “End Show” at the top of the page.
  - 3) Then save your changes



## Compress Media (Windows only)

- 1) File tab > Info > Compress Media\* > Internet Quality
  - a. Please note: Compress media is only available after you have added any type of multimedia files, such as narration or video, to your presentation.
- 2) **SAVE** your presentation (.pptx) – keep the original format in case you need to edit later.

## Upload to D2L Assignment Folder (students)

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- 1) Presentation files with sound and images can be very large and will take longer to upload. It is recommended that you upload your file using a hard-wired broadband connection to avoid connectivity issues, or D2L upload/ time-out problems.
- 2) Do not try to upload the file directly from a flash drive (usb) or online storage location like Dropbox (online), or One Drive.
