THE NINE OF IX:

Title IX is a landmark federal civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in education

Title IX does not only apply to female students

Schools must be proactive in ensuring the campus is free from sex discrimination

Schools must have an established procedure in place to investigate complaints

Schools must take immediate action to ensure the survivor can continue his/her education free from discrimination

Schools may not retaliate against the complainant

Schools can issue a no-contact order to the accused

In cases of sexual violence, schools are prohibited from encouraging mediation in lieu of a formal hearing 08

Schools cannot discourage a complainant from continuing his or her education.

Did you know?

- One in five women will be sexually assaulted during college while only 1 in 25 college men will be sexually assaulted.
- Most college victims are assaulted by someone they know.
- 42% of college women who are raped tell no one about the assault.
- It is estimated that only 5% of sexual assaults on college campuses are reported, making sexual assault the most underreported crime.
