The video was posted to TiKTok, and seen by the Clarion University Community. Alcohol was seen in the video, and comments in the video included “I’m going to peer pressure her” or “I’m going to make her” in reference to drinking. During the investigation it was found the organization held a scavenger hunt at the Clarion Walmart for new members.	The organization was found responsible as the video and scavenger hunt were direct violations of the University’s Hazing policies.	All members of Delta Phi Epsilon must individually complete the Alcohol 101+ module. The organization was placed on probation starting December 10 th , 2021. Probation will end a year from when all members complete the module. Delta Phi Epsilon’s suspension of recruitment, new member program, rituals, social events, and any other type of event that has the intent to recruit will remain in place until the Fall of 2022.	A University Conduct Board hearing was convened on December 3, 2021 to review this alleged violation. The decision letter with the outcome of the hearing was provided to the organization on December 6, 2021.
