One credit from Personal Performance is allowed.

B.S. in Liberal Studies

Liberal Studies is a multidisciplinary degree program. A total of 72 credits are required in the major with a minimum GPA of 2.0. Liberal studies students complete 33 credits of lower-level (100-200) and 39 credits of upper-level (300 and above) Arts and Sciences courses. Maximum course work in a single discipline is limited to 39 credit hours. All courses must be selected in consultation with an advisor.

Course selection in this area can include coursework identified in the general education requirements section. Courses counting in general education cannot also be used to satisfy the requirements in the major. Thirty nine credits of upper-level (300 and above) courses in Arts and Sciences and would most likely need to be taken through Clarion University.

A concentration is not required; however, many on-campus concentrations are also available. If a concentration is available online, it will be noted below with an asterisk.

College of Arts & Sciences concentrations available in:

College of Education & Human Services concentrations available in:

Residency Requirement

A minimum of 30 of the last 45 credits must be taken through Clarion University with at least 50 percent of major credits taken through Clarion.
