“Fair Use” Question Prompts Changes In Electronic Reserves At Clarion University



Recent activities in the court system concerning "fair use" and copyright have prompted the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) and the Chancellor's Office to ask state universities to review and adjust their procedures for placing copyrighted materials on E-Reserves.

While finalized guidelines are not yet available, the library has taken the precaution of changing procedures to be more in line with anticipated state policies. To this end, the Libraries are asking that faculty requesting activation of existing or new E-Reserve material review the Libraries' reserve policy at <http://www.clarion.edu/79102/>, and complete the Library Reserve Request Form available at <http://www.clarion.edu/114532/>.

To facilitate the new process, we are providing both an on-line, fill-able PDF as well as a Word document format of the Reserve Request Form for users' convenience.

Requested material will be placed on E-Reserves while copyright permission is obtained, if necessary. Any questions concerning these new procedures should be directed to reserves@clarion.edu.

Computer Tip: Quickly Delete A Line Of Text!

Here is a quick tip for anyone who has found themselves acting like a telegraph operator on the backspace key. You know what I'm talking about. You've just finished a line of text, it doesn't look right, so you want to delete the whole line. "*Ratta-tatta-ratta-ratta*", and your finger falls off...

There is a better way! Simply put your cursor at the beginning of the line you want to delete and press **Shift+End**.



This will cause the whole line to be selected, and all you have to do is press **delete** or **backspace** to finish the job! The best part is that because your cursor is already at the beginning of the line, all you have to do is type!
