Purpose:

The College of Business Administration (COBA) supports the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) which awards academic credits for certain courses. In general, these examinations are designed for adult learners and non-traditional students who have gained college-level knowledge through prior education or training.

Procedures:

The student will arrange for CLEP testing through the CLEP Test Administrator at the Venango Campus. To have CLEP scores evaluated for credit, students should submit an official transcript to Clarion University's Dean of Enrollment Management.

The College of Business Administration does not play a direct role in the CLEP testing program.
