IV. Report of the University Audited Financial Statements for the Year Ending 2020.

Ms. Nancy Gunza and Mr. Jared Clark, CliftonLarsonAllen, presented the University's audited financials for the prior year. The audit process was performed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards.

V. Staff & Student Highlight

Sarah Zerfoss, Coordinator of Judicial Affairs & Residence Life Education, and Taylor Boyle, Junior, Political Science and Economics major with an Advanced Paralegal Certificate, presented their Campus Vote project to the Trustees. The Engaged Coalition mission was to encourage students to register to vote and educate them on the voting process. They hosted several events leading up to November 3 election day such as: Constitution Day, National Voters Registration day, Debate Watch Parties and Election Day Coalition. They were successful in getting faculty to include voting language in their syllabi.

VI. Report of Student Senate

Senate President, Chelsea Mason, reported that the Students in Need Scholarship ends December 3. The Social Equity and Awards banquet will look different this year with graphics through social media. The sports awards will be conducted through email. Their hope is to recognize these receipts in an inperson ceremony next year. In addition, she is a student advocate on the CCE Integration.

VII. Report of Student Trustee

Student Trustee, Kaitlyn Krupa, reported that she participates on the Spring Reopening Committee. She leads the COVID-19 Task Force for student leaders to work and educate peers from spreading the virus. In addition, she is a student advocate for the CCE Integration. Senate has been holding Town Halls on student concerns of campus facilities.

VIII. Report of Faculty Senate

Senate Chair, Dr. Jackie Knaust, reported that Senate met with David Dollins who provided enrollment and admissions visit updates. Dr. Susanne Fenske provided a Student Affairs update, and last week Senate finalized the proposal for curricular changes.

IX. Report of the Office of Diversity, Social Equity, & Multicultural Education

Rogers Laugand reported that the Inclusive Community Assessment Team is following up with students regarding a social media post. The Inclusive Community Assessment Team had some issues with the online form for reporting incidents. He has been working with the Office of Greek Life to bring back Black fraternities and sororities on campus. They are also looking into the process of creating a Black Lives Matter chapter on campus. Building Bridges facilitated a session with the department of Student Engagement & Development last week where several employees participated. The employee facilitated dialogue focused on issues on diversity and inclusion. The sessions went very well and they hope to continue these dialogues next semester. His office hosted the MLK series event, "Black Lives & the Legacy of George Floyd: A Conversation" on November 11.

X. Report of Finance, Administration and Facilities

Len Cullo reported he received notice from the PA Department of General Services (DGS) that they will be processing Clarion a \$2.2 million reimbursement for the Tippin project. They are making progress on the ADA projects in Steven and Moore Halls, and he received approval from DGS for the demolition of Carrier hall.

XI. Report of University Advancement

Jim Geiger reported that he has been coordinating the communication for President Pehrsson's appointment as interim president at Edinboro and also COVID-19 updates. They continue to update the FAQs on the webpage for potential and current students. They have implemented a COVID tracker.

In addition, he presented a fundraising report and announced they will be launching the Giving Tuesday campaign on December 1.

XII. Report of the Board of Governors

Trustee Weaver was not present for his report at this time during the meeting; however, Trustee Bauer remarked that Trustee Weaver was pertinent in the Board of Governor's decision in selecting President Pehrsson as Interim President at Edinboro and thanked him.

XIII. Report of Enrollment Management

David Dollins reported that the Admissions team has been conducting high school visits over Zoom, providing campus visits, and preview days for families. Faculty are participating in these events. They mailed paper applications to students in addition to the online option. They purchased an additional 22,000 senior names for their marketing efforts. The Center for Student Outreach and Success Coaching workshop is scheduled for spring with advisors and support students. Financial Aid is finalizing award letters and those will be mailed to freshman before Thanksgiving. This is much early than past years.

XIV. Report of Academic Affairs

Dr. Pam Gent reported they have received an unofficial recommendation for reaccreditation for many of their academic programs. The Department of Visual and Performing Arts will be hosting a virtual performance in November. Hope Lineman, dean of career and workforce development, has been asked to serve as a special assistant to Chancellor Greenstein on the System's role in workforce development, meeting workforce needs, and incorporating Council for Adult and Experiential Learning recommendations

XV. Report of Student Affairs

Dr. Susanne Fenske reported her staff is busy keeping students safe and providing remote program offerings and services to students. They will be moving students out of the residence halls on November 20. They conducted a survey that went to the Clarion and Venango campus students asking for their feedback on the fall semester activities and programs that were offered and what events they would like to see in the spring. The deadline for the student to complete the survey is December 14. PSAC board voted to cancel fall and winter sports, however, the league has permitted league championship play for both cross country and swimming and diving. XVI. Report of PACT

Trustee Bauer reported that PACT met in late October and Clarion trustees were very well represented. The key topic of the meeting was the student trustee panel which Trustee Krupa participated.

XVII. Report of the Clarion University Foundation, Inc.

Trustee Kifer reported that he attended his first meeting with the Foundation Board. They reviewed the audit report, lease agreements with the University, and discussed the recent sale of the Barnes Center.

XVIII. Report of the President

President Pehrsson provided an update on the Western Region Integration process. Dr. Fenske will serve as the Quality Assurance Representative to all three universities and Kelly Moran, CalU, has been appointed the project manager. They formed 17 working groups in this process and have been given their Charge. It's a very aggressive timeline. They recently established the Commission for Military Affairs, and faculty and staff participated in a virtual homecoming earlier this fall.
