[ABI/INFORM Complete](#) is a business information resource that provides full-text access to scholarly and trade journal articles, dissertations, conference proceedings, marketing and industry reports, business case studies, and

global trade news from 1971 to the current date. It includes *ABI/INFORM Dateline*, *ABI/INFORM Global*, *ABI/INFORM Research*, and *ABI/INFORM Trade and Industry*.

- *ABI/INFORM Dateline* focuses upon full-text regional titles and specializes on hard-to-find regional business publications with news and analysis of local companies and markets.
- *ABI/INFORM Global* is a comprehensive business database offering the latest business and financial information from throughout the world. It includes in-depth coverage from thousands of publications about business conditions, management techniques, business trends, management practice and theory, corporate strategy and tactics, and competitive landscape.
- *ABI/INFORM Research* provides access to 1,250 full-text journals covering a variety of business-related subject areas including financial, pharmaceuticals, manufacturing, and more

- *ABI/INFORM Trade & Industry* provides critical information about companies, products, and executives, as well as in-depth news and analysis of industry trends and developments.

The Minion's Master Moves: Five Ways To Improve Your Laptop Battery Life

You shouldn't have to be tethered to your desk to use your laptop. While battery life is improving, it still isn't perfect. If you've got a *Windows 8.1* machine, these tips will help you squeeze the most juice of your computer's battery.

Software updates

Microsoft routinely issues patches and software updates to fix bugs and add new features to Windows. Not only will these updates help keep your system more secure, but they can sometimes also improve your battery life.

Tweak power settings

You can tweak things like brightness, when the display will turn off, and when the computer will go to sleep, among other things. Clicking on the "Change advanced power settings" will open the door to even more customization options.

Dim the display

The display on your laptop uses a ton of energy. When you disconnect the power cord, it's best to dim the brightness down below half or to a level that is suitable for your eyes.


Turn off Bluetooth

Even if you don't have a wireless mouse or speakers connected, having Bluetooth enabled will still draw power from your computer's battery.

Disconnect any dongles

As is the case with Bluetooth, a USB-connected device (such as a flash drive) will also drain your battery. If the power cord is unplugged, charging your smartphone or tablet via a USB port will also reduce your battery life.


Computer Tip: Shade Blank Excel Cells

Sometimes a user needs or wants to make sure blank cells stand out so they can be acknowledged and/or dealt with. This can be accomplished by using the Conditional Formatting feature.

1. Select/highlight the range of cells you want considered for Conditional Formatting. On the Home tab, select the **Conditional Formatting** button, then select **Highlight Cell Rules** and **Equal To ...**

2. In the **Format cells that are EQUAL TO:** box, click the **space bar** one time (one blank space tells Excel to apply the formatting to any cell that does not contain any information). You can also use this to shade cells with specific information by putting the desired information in the **EQUAL TO:** box. **Example:** Typing **6000** would shade cells **C2** and **E3** in the image.
3. In the **with** box to the right, click the drop-down  button to select **Custom Format ...** at the bottom of the list.
4. In the **Format Cells** dialog box, select the desired tab (such as the Fill tab) and then select the desired formatting (such as shading with the color yellow). Click **OK** when you are finished. The blank cells will now be shaded.
