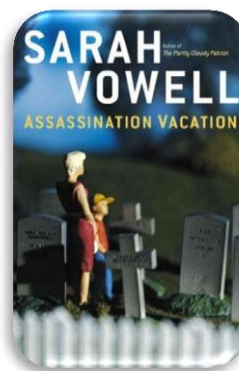

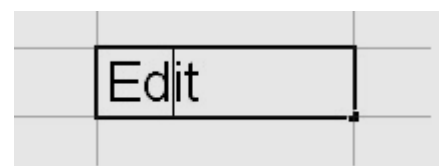

Computer Tip: Edit Within The Excel Cell

Often when a user needs to change the information contained in a cell, he or she will go to the cell and begin to type. Unfortunately, this removes *all* information that was previously in the cell.

Try *this* instead: Double click inside the cell to freely edit any item *without* changing the other items within the cell.



When there is a vertical line in the cell (aka, the *insertion point*), it is safe to begin typing.
