

THE EMERGING LEADERS PROGRAM

The Emerging Leaders Program gives first- and second-year students the opportunity to learn about, use and reflect on leadership skills while exploring issues that influence our lives and environments. The program gets students connected to campus, helps them understand programming processes, gives them the tools to build a plan for continued leadership growth at Clarion, and introduces them to the Social Change Model of Leadership.

The program begins with a three day-retreat focused on personal exploration and team building. Throughout the semester, regular program sessions are held on Monday evenings. Sessions follow the components of the Social Change Model,

with activities and presentations by various members

of the campus community each week. Using what they learn as they go along, Emerging Leaders match their personal interests, skills, and leadership strengths to build toward a brighter future for everyone.

During the semester, Emerging Leaders will:

- Build a sample service project based on individual values and interests
- Plan Community Service Day within their group
- Plan the Halloween party (Oct. 25, 2014) on campus in which organizations provide treats and activities for community children (fall semester only)
- Plan Come Together Clarion, a campus and community food drive (spring semester only)

While in Emerging Leaders, students learn about additional leadership opportunities that are available to them while they are at Clarion. Upon completion of the program, students have the option to:

- Join the Advisory Board for Leadership and Engagement
- Attend student leadership empowerment programs sessions
- Carry out their service project
- Become an Emerging Leaders mentor
- Join the Leaders in Action committee

COMMUNITY SERVICE DAY

Community Service Day is a one-day event each semester planned and sponsored by the Emerging Leaders cohort. Emerging Leaders work on all aspects of the event: volunteer recruitment, site contact and registration, public relations, budgeting, hospitality, transportation and evaluation.

Community Service Day sends approximately 200-250 student volunteers into the greater Clarion community and surrounding area to work on a variety of service projects. These projects have included: working in Cook Forest state park, participating in activities with local children, cleaning the local streets, working at local churches and working in residential support facilities. The tentative date for Community Service Day this year is Oct. 4, 2014.
